## **Quail Hollow Championship**

CHARLOTTE, North Carolina --- April 29, 2010 --- A few associates from Green Resource volunteered on the golf course and hosted a breakfast for volunteers and maintenance staff at the Quail Hollow Championship, a PGA Tour sanctioned golf tournament. There were two work shifts: early morning and late afternoon. Volunteers performed the following functions: hand-raking bunkers, filling divots on tees and fairways, moving television cables, retrieving tee markers and flagpoles, and removing dew from tees, fairways, and rough.

### **Quail Hollow Club**

The Quail Hollow Club is a country club and golf course located in the Quail Hollow neighborhood in Charlotte, North Carolina. It is a private member club, founded by James J. Harris on April 13, 1959. The club hosted the Kemper Open from 1969 through 1979, the PaineWebber Invitational from 1983 through 1989, and has hosted the Quail Hollow Championship (known as the Wachovia Championship prior to 2009) since it debuted in 2003.

The course was originally designed by golf course architect George Cobb in 1961 to capture the beauty as well as challenging terrain of the Piedmont region. In the intervening years, the course underwent a series of improvements, including modifications of several holes by Arnold Palmer in 1986, and a redesign by Tom Fazio in 1997 and 2003.

Quail Hollow will host the PGA Championship, the final men's major of the year, in 2017.
